THEA 2336: Voice I for the Actor

- Introductory course for students to improve their ability to communicate through more effective use of the voice.

Trainings and Workshops

Theatrical Intimacy Education: Foundations of Race, Intimacy, & Consent for BIPOC and Race & Choreography (Kaja Dunn)

November 2, 2022

Two workshops led by TIE Faculty Member Kaja Dunn on the impact race has on physical storytelling and considerations necessary for choreographing culturally competent intimacy.

Theatrical Intimacy Education: Educator Advocate Program June 27-July 1, 2022

TIE Educator-Advocate Program is to make TIE's already accessible training more accessible for educational and professional organizations with educational programming. Participants spend 5 days with TIE educators and other arts leaders to be better equipped to support consent-based learning environments in their schools. They go deeper into choreographing intimacy, learn the process of intimacy coordination, DEI training, traumainformed practices training, Cognitive Equity in Design, basic modesty garment training, consent-based casting policies, writing policy, and bystander intervention training.

artEquity's Everyday Justice: Antiracism as Daily Practice (Carmen Morgan & Michael Robertson) June 10 &13, 2022

A two-day training to deepen your analysis and clarify antiracist values in your daily life. Everyday we must work to align our antiracist values with our thoughts and actions. The only cure for racism is doing the work of everyday justice. It is no longer a question of if we should engage in this work. The question is how. This conversation provided frameworks and a baseline analysis for antiracism strategies and action.

Antiracist Theatre Training-Level Up (Nicole Brewer-Level II Course) April 2022

This one day, three-hour, course is about leveraging your anti-racist theatre ethos in shaping and sustaining an equitable container. Participants examine the three degrees of racism: interpersonal/individual, institutional, cultural and how the practice of "static equity" combine to hinder our ability to impactfully disrupt racist and oppressive conditions in our collaborations. Level Up also explores how your anti-racist theatre ethos helps you better discern the anti-racist and anti-oppressive practices to support the container that's right for your goal.

Certificate in Effective Instruction from Association of College and University Educators (2022) Aug. 2021-April 2022

This certificate signifies my completion of a 25-module course in effective teaching practices requiring the implementation of evidence-based instructional approaches. The credential is co-issued by the American Council on Education and distinguishes faculty for their commitment to educational excellence and student success.

Theatrical Intimacy Education: Best Practices June 2021/August 2021

This workshop covers TIE's Best Practices, including tools for developing a consent-based process, setting boundaries, desexualizing the process, choreographing intimacy, and documentation.

Antiracist Theatre Training (Nicole Brewer) July/August 2021

A.R.T. blends anti-racist theory, social justice, collectivism, healing justice and theatre exercises for an embodied understanding of racism and our agency to become anti-racist. In this two-part six hour course, participants gain the tools to craft their own unique anti-racist theatre ethos and delve into the three core principles of anti-racist theatre: harm reduction, harm prevention and relationship repair.
